1. What are your qualifications for this elected position?

Working in the maritime industry for many years I have had several positions including directing port operations for the port of New York and New Jersey. We are a landlord port and I was responsible for negotiating leases with every corner of the industry. Upon retiring I established my consulting business and worked for many years with ports in The Netherlands, Mexico, United States and Asia.

2. If elected, what are your goals for this office and what would you like to achieve in this position?

Working with other commissioners, I will identify new projects, complete projects under way and prioritize projects that respond to the charter. Specific projects that I will champion are building additional public boat ramps, codify and add no wake zones and investigate the feasibility of Establishing a scheduled ferry service for passengers that will operate between several intra-harbor locations.

Upon being elected, I will suggest forming a public/private partnerships team that will address the very real congestion issues facing the county and identify solutions.
